



Bon Secours Hospital, Galway

Works comprised of part demolition of the existing hospital and the construction of a three storey building extension. The project also included the refurbishment of part of the existing operational hospital.

The new building consists of two levels of 51 bed units, a ground level physiotherapy unit, multipurpose room, isolation rooms, nurses' stations, offices, and meeting rooms. The second phase of this project consisted of the refurbishment of part of the existing operational hospital. This included the refurbishment of old theatres on the first and second floors and office areas on the ground floor to convert them into a nurses' station, treatment rooms and an assisted bathroom.

A major part of the works included the construction of new kitchen facilities and a full strip out and refurbishment of the existing kitchen was also carried out.
